What a difference six months makes! At the start of 2019, we had completed the new addition (finally!), moved into our new workspaces, created our new Teen Room and Children's Room, and began booking our beautiful new Community Room with library programs, community meetings, and special events. In addition, using BP settlement funds approved by Pinellas County, we recently added a new parking lot at the front of the building to alleviate the critical situation of not enough spaces for patrons' cars.

Although we did not receive funding to complete the renovations for the main public area, we will be making some upgrades during the Labor Day weekend. Come September, you will see new flooring and carpeting (thanks to MSTU funds from Pinellas County), an updated computer area with additional workspaces for patrons with their own devices, and some new furniture. We will also be moving things around to improve space allocation.

The increase in programs and services has been phenomenal . Our creative, enthusiastic staff members have been coming up with all sorts of new ideas. Please check the monthly newsletter or the online calendar to view the plethora of free or low-cost offerings.—everything from Microsoft Office classes to ghostly tales! What are we planning for the end of the year? A BIG celebration is on the horizon - our 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in November. Hard to believe that this little library that started as a storefront and finally had its own building in 1999 has now grown to be the community center of the East Lake corridor!

Two special events planned for the anniversary are "Turn Back the Clock - Turn Back the



And now we are beginning a "New Chapter," a Strategic Plan for 2019- 2022; this is a roadmap for future goals and objectives with plenty of detours that can result in innovative and creative outcomes. The Book Nook is the resale shop just inside the front door of the East Lake Community Library that is managed and staffed by the Friends of East Lake Community Library, an all-volunteer organization. We rely on donations from patrons to fill the shelves.

Not all items donated to the Book Nook are sold by us. Some new books and gently used books go directly into the library collection for adults and children. Some donated items deemed to have value are listed on Amazon and Ebay websites.

#### Thank You to Rotary of East Lake Sunrise

In April, the Rotary Club of East Lake Sunrise gave a \$1,000 grant to the Friends of East Lake Community Library. These funds will be used to unveil a series of "Ready, Set, Read" Kits that promote early literacy and social interaction between parents (or caregivers, teachers, grandparents, etc.) and young children. The Youth Services Department will be working on these kits over the next four months with the ultimate goal of having ten self-contained theme kits, each in its own rolling duffle bag, that includes books, toys, puzzles, games, movies, and activity sheets on specific topics of interest to preschoolers; these kits will focus on such subjects as dinosaurs, outer space, community help-

ers, transportation, etc. The kits can be checked out and returned to the Children's Room while parents can keep the reproducible activity sheets to reinforce skills and learning with their children. We thank the Friends of East Lake Community Library and the Rotary Club for funding this project and providing a new service to the families of our community.



Call for information or just show up at a meeting. All are welcome!





ELCL Foundation board members participated in the Library's planning meeting in March, providing input on the Strategic Plan 2019-2022 (available in the Library and online). To support these long-term ambitions, the Foundation continues to grow the endowment available for larger projects. More recently, we received a significant donation to name the Deanna and Tom

Bennett Community Room. We are so grateful for the generosity of our community and we take this as a sign of greater things to come!
