### Welcome Back, East Lake!

Like the monarch butterfly that emerges from its cocoon, the library and the community are slowly coming out and re-engaging with each other. We have begun to have in-person meetings and programs as well as hybrid programs that give participants a choice of in-person or virtual options. Our summer reading club is in full swing and we are proud to point out that we are the first public library in the area to offer a special teen series called Creative Insights Journey, made possible in part by the generosity of the Friends of East Lake Community Library.

In a continuing effort to provide digital resources to our patrons, we have added an online practice tests database called Mometrix (No more looking for those heavy books that are ALWAYS checked out!). In the next few months, we will be unveiling a new collaborative online collection with Palm Harbor Library called CloudLibrary which will give our patrons exclusive access to bestsellers and Sunshine State Readers; hopefully, this will reduce the wait time for popular titles.

Even before COVID, East Lake Community Library had little usable space for patrons to utilize their own devices. To alleviate this situation and take advantage of outdoor space, we are extending our WiFi to a new **"Tech Deck"** - a covered pavilion on the side patio near the Community Room with outlets and device chargers. There will also be a solar charging bench with easily accessible USB ports on the sides and a wheelchair

accessible picnic table with attached seating. Part of the funding for this project was made possible through MSTU (Municipal Services Taxing Unit) dollars approved by the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners. We keep trying to find ways to fulfill our mission and effectively serve the community - not to mention the health benefits of being outdoors!

To celebrate this new addition and the fact that we can finally come together after a year of isolation, the Library will host a free **"Slice of Summer" Family Celebration on Saturday, August 28<sup>th</sup> from 12:30 – 3:30 PM**. Included in the festivities will be a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new Tech Deck, a local DJ featuring the sounds of Key West and Jimmy Buffet, games and activities for the kids, free refreshments, raffle baskets, representatives from our local community partners, and displays and exhibits from our library staff. Do NOT miss it...and don't forget to wear your Hawaiian shirts and flip-flops!

There will be a return to normal hours immediately after Labor Day as well as the addition of Sunday hours for the remainder of the school year. Effective September 7<sup>th</sup>, the library hours will be: Monday – Wednesday, 10 AM – 8 PM; Thursdays, 12PM – 8PM; Fridays, 10 AM -- 6 PM; Saturdays, 10 AM – 4PM; Sundays, 12PM – 4 PM. If you need materials when the library is closed, don't forget our 24/7 Hold-It locker system that you can request as an option when reserving your items.

Our library's expansion completed in 2018 was called Phase 1 and doubled the size of our building to create meeting spaces and room to increase our collections. Despite this, you may be surprised to learn that ELCL still has the smallest library per capita served in all of Pinellas County and one of the smallest in the state of Florida! As an increasing number of patrons return to ELCL, the need for space grows. The vision of Phase 2 is to further expand our library for additional study rooms, offices, and space for community programs...but we can't do this without **you**.

The ELCL Foundation supports the East Lake Community Library through funding capital improvement projects like the Phase 2 building expansion, with 100% of funds going directly to these projects thanks to our board of community volunteers. ## Food Pantry—Take What You Need. Share What You Can.

We are encouraged by the positive community support for this service through donations of food and funds for the pantry by our patrons and staff..

The food pantry contains non-perishable can goods, boxed items and personal items and is accessible 24/7. It is located next to the 24/7 Hold-It Lockers on the south side of the library building.

The items we can use the most are: canned fruit and canned meats or fish (prepared chili, beef stew, canned ham, tuna, chicken, Chef Boyardee canned meals such as ravioli, spaghetti and meatballs, etc.). Pull top cans are preferable. Also, wrapped rolls of toilet paper, toothpaste and soap are popular. Please do NOT add perishable items like fresh fruit, bread, etc. and NO pills of any kind. Since the Food Pantry has been so successful, we are in the process of getting a new waterproof cabinet, courtesy of the Friends of the Library.
